

SELECTION PROCEDURES













- ✓ Online application, through an ad-hoc website accessible from elarch website (www.elarch.org)
- ✓ After registration, candidates will receive passwords to accede to the <u>application form</u>, where they will fill in personal data, select desired host institution and study programmes, submit the relevant motivation statements and upload supporting document
- ✓ Candidates will indicate the chosen host institution by expressing a maximum of <u>3 preferences</u>
- ✓ In order to open the calls each partner has to provide an updated version of the <u>academic offer available</u> to candidates in all available fields of study at their own institutions

3 TARGET GROUPS: TG1, TG2, TG3

Distribution rules:

- ➤ **Target Group 1** mobility must represent at **least 50%** of the individual mobility covered by the project
- ➤ **Target Group 2** mobility must represent at **least 10%** of the individual mobility covered by the project
- ➤ **Target Group 3** mobility must represent at **least 20%** of the individual mobility from Latin American countries (group A and group B)
 - Mobility from **Group A** countries must represent **at least 50%** of the individual mobility from Latin American countries (group A + B)

Candidates general eligibility criteria will be clearly published on the website and based on the Erasmus Mundus Programme Guide







Academic evaluation

Pre-selection by the host institution on the basis of the candidates' study results in the relevant study areas, language skills, motivation, recommendations etc.

Pre-selection results will be forwarded to the Selection Committee → distribution of mobilities based on the respect of cross-cutting issues (gender balance, equal opportunities, participation of disadvantaged groups) and balance criteria















ORGANIZATION OF MOBILITY - SELECTION

Selection

the Mobility Selection Committee <u>prepares a final list of selected Candidates</u>
 for all the <u>mobilities assignment on the respect of gender balance, equal opportunities, participation of disadvantaged group and balance criteria + a reserve list + plus a list of rejected applications.</u> The Coordinator notified the results to applicants concerned and to the host Institution.

AND THEN..... PRIOR THE MOBILITY ABROAD

- The beneficiary will contact the Coordinator to plan foreseen date of arrival> the Coordinator will inform the host institution > the Host institution send the invitation letter for obtaining visa
- The Coordinator reserves travel ticket for all the grantees + will start insurance procedures> the beneficiary will receive insurance policy via email








DISTRIBUTION OF INDIVIDUALY MOBILITY IN THE RESPECTIVE ANNUAL MOBILITY COHORT

NUMBER OF SCHOLARSHIPS




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DISTRIBUTION OF MOBILITY 1st + 2nd + 3rd Cohort





